Details: Since late September, SEVEN occupied residential burglaries occurred in the Boundary Creek Neighborhood. With the exception of the most recent incident (12/22), the suspect(s) entered residences through unsecured doors and stole cash and purses. Please see page 2 for a map of incident locations.

Maple Grove Police are asking residents to be aware of suspicious activity, vehicles, and individuals, and also reminding everyone to call 9-1-1 IMMEDIATELY.

If you observed suspicious activity (unfamiliar vehicles parked on the street, unknown individuals walking in yards) around the time of these incidents, please report information to the Maple Grove Police Department by contacting **Detective Jon Proulx at 763-494-6224**. Tips

- **Keep doors locked and garage doors closed at all times.**
- Make sure your personal property inventory is current - record serial numbers, photograph jewelry, and keep this record in a discreet place.
- Place several lights in your home on timers. These lights ensure that you always come home to an illuminated residence and also gives the appearance that someone is home, even when you are not
- Leave a radio or TV on when you are gone. This noise introduces voices into your home and also suggests that someone is in the residence.
- If someone rings your doorbell or knocks on your door, go and look. Be sure that the person(s) at your door sees you. You are not obligated to answer the door, but this confirms that someone is in the residence.
- Remove garage door openers from vehicles if you park in your. Occasionally, individuals will enter vehicles in driveways to obtain garage door openers and then gain access to a home.
