### Meeting Minutes

September 14, 2016

Jon states he has been hearing more in the media recently about an increase in residential and car thefts and is wondering if Maple Grove is experiencing an increase in these crimes and what the response from our police has been.</p> <p>CAC Member Piket: Signage for the Children’s Learning Adventure located at 13001 62nd Pl N. Joe is asking if the exterior facility signage for this property is in compliance with City code in terms of the amount, size, location, and lighting. Joe states the signage all seems excessive compared to what his business was allowed as the owner of Primrose Schools. Joe asks if Children Learning Adventure was granted any sort of signage variance during the City approval process.</p>		
<b>Economic Development Manager</b>	The Committee welcomed City of Maple Grove Economic Development Manager Carie Fuhrman. Ms. Fuhrman introduced herself and provided background on how this newly created position of Economic Development Manager came about. Ms. Fuhrman provided a handout of		

her PowerPoint presentation which detailed action items as part of her position. She has been in the position for two months.

Ms. Fuhrman spoke about outreach to businesses and establishing relationships. She talked about meeting with the Minnesota Department of Economic Development and Hennepin County as well several other organizations in the northwest metro area.

Ms. Fuhrman talked about Tax Increment Financing particularly related to the Gravel Mining Area. Questions and answers took place about the level of positions that will be created and long-term career rather than minimum wage positions being established. Ms. Fuhrman stated that companies involved with TIF submit annual reports to ensure they are meeting employment and wage requirements.

Ms. Fuhrman was asked about having a healthy balance in the use of TIF. She talked about protecting the tax base. She said Maple Grove has been conservative in using tax abatement and that TIF is a strong economic development tool.

Ms. Fuhrman talked about establishing a policy for use of incentives for expansion and recruitment, which is one of the action items. She was asked if the City has identified any particular industries or uses that they'd like to see in particular areas. She answered that things are pretty broad right now. Comprehensive plan committee meetings have just started so no specifics have been established.

Ms. Fuhrman stated that the organization Greater Minneapolis has identified both Maple Grove and Plymouth as med-tech. The impact of the hospital and the number of healthcare providers and businesses was discussed.

Ms. Fuhrman then went on to talk about the land use and zoning in the Gravel Mining Area and 610 corridor. When asked, she stated it is not expected that there will be large warehouses with a low number of employees in the GMA.

Ms. Fuhrman talked about creating marketing and communications plans for economic development which would include a logo/tagline, marketing materials and social media. She encouraged CAC members to follow the City via social media.

The question was asked if she envisioned adding more staff; she stated not at this time. She was asked about the Doran site at Elm Creek Boulevard and Hemlock Lane and if there were any funding issues as there seemed to be a delay. She stated that the development agreement was being finalized.

The residential and business development items in the CAC agenda packet were referenced. These are updated month by the Community Development Department and will be provided in future CAC agenda packets.

Ms. Fuhrman provided an update on Hy-Vee and discussion ensued on the proposed north and south Maple Grove locations.

The question was asked about how Maple Grove compares in cost per square foot. She stated that Maple Grove was comparable. She stated that office space is harder to fill.

Discussion took place about retail. People want independents but then need to support those businesses. Ms. Fuhrman stated that retail is changing, particularly with online shopping.

The following items were discussed:

- Menards expansion of their lumberyard
- Expansion of Parnassus School in Zachary Square Shopping Center
- Tile Shop and Five Below coming in the former Gander Mountain space
- Park Nicollet building in front of Target

The question was asked if Maple Grove Hospital was designed to add more floors. The consensus was yes but not sure how many levels. Mike Opatz stated he would check into.

The Mirabel development of single level residences was mentioned.

The Committee thanked Ms. Fuhrman for her time and stated they would appreciate updates monthly or so. Mike Opatz stated that he can share them with CAC.

**Youth Sports  
Subcommittee  
Final Report**

The subcommittee received the final report that afternoon, and Mike Opatz handed it out at the meeting. This report was intended to be the final report but it was uncertain if the comments from City Administrator Heidi Nelson were included. CAC members were reminded that any more comments could hinder moving forward. Everyone has one week to provide comments, and after that, no more input will be accepted.

Discussion ensued about if all comments received had been included in this current version. CAC Member Tim Klevar will confirm that all comments have been included.

It was stated the committee needs to decide about creating a concise course of action for the Council as requested by Councilmember Johnson. Each section in the executive summary has a call to action and recommendation.

The question was asked when the City will see initial feedback from the community survey and see if possibly the Youth Sports Report formal presentation to the Council will mesh up with the survey results.

Regarding the presentation to the Council of the Youth Sports Report, it was stated that it would be good to have all CAC members at the Council meeting. The date would probably be either November 7 or November 21. CAC members were asked if they would be willing to attend, and they said yes.

Discussion took place about sharing the report with the various athletic associations/organizations prior to the presentation to the City Council. It was decided that, when a date has been set for the Council presentation, the associations would be notified of that.

The suggestion was made to highlight/list the main action items at the front of the report, but that they also be kept in the body of the report.

The date the report will go on the Council agenda for CAC's presentation should be known shortly after CAC's final approval of the report at their meeting on October 12, 2016.

#### **Other Matters**

**Community Survey:** 405 mailed responses have been received so far. The link to the online survey will be posted again on the City's social media platforms. The survey results will be tabulated in November with a final report received in late December 2016 or early January 2017.

**CAC reappointments:** Notification has been sent to those CAC members who are up for reappointment. The committee may wish to give consideration to filling any vacancies.

**Department presentations:** The following ideas were brought forth for updates to the Committee at upcoming meeting: City Assessor, Police, Fire and Engineering/Public Works. With regard to a Police presentation, one was given fairly recently, and the suggestion was made to wait until the community survey is done. An update on the land use/comprehensive plan progress would be good for a spring meeting.

The October CAC meeting will center on the Youth Sports Report.

Good morning Mike,

In July and August, the Maple Grove Police Department investigated the report of 14 residential burglaries that occurred primarily in the northern part of the city. Some have occurred in the southwest and southeast part of the city. In general, the suspect(s) would enter an unlocked vehicle, open a garage door with an opener found inside the vehicle, and enter the residence through an unlocked door. Entry was also made by open garage doors and unlocked service doors. In some cases, a suspect was interrupted by a resident. The patrol division responded to each incident, searched the area if possible for suspect(s) (to include a K-9 Unit and Minnesota State Patrol Helicopter), had Hennepin County Crime Lab process the scene for evidence, and the cases have been assigned to our Investigations Unit. To help prevent further burglaries and assist in apprehending the suspect(s) the police department has taken the following action.

- Broadcast information about the incidents and prevention information to Block Captains, to the entire city through social media, and Twelve TV. Many Block Captains will share information throughout their neighborhood via social media.
- Conduct ongoing proactive patrols to include the use of uniform and undercover personnel.
- The Investigations Unit has shared intelligence and investigative time with other agencies to follow-up on leads, develop potential suspects, and attempt to locate stolen property.
- Chief Werner held a community meeting on September 15, 2016. A panel of police department personnel presented information about the cases, provided crime prevention information, and answered questions from the public. Approximately 102 citizens attended the meeting. Information about the meeting was broadcast on Twelve TV. Links to the broadcast and other information related to the cases is provided below.

Mike:

Below is an update on my earlier CAC Report Response from January 2016 regarding traffic-related issues on Weaver Lake Road, west of I-94. Specifically:

- Long delays at traffic lights
- Increase in traffic volume in recent weeks
- Has the County recently conducted any traffic light studies or updates on the light sequencing of that corridor?
- Are there any new plans for roadway or signalization improvements?

**Background:** Weaver Lake Road, west of I-94 is one of the highest volume City street in Maple Grove. On an average weekday, over 32,000 vehicles use Weaver Lake Road between West Fish Lake Road and I-94. The capacity of a four-lane divided roadway with turn lanes at major intersections is generally considered to be 32,000 vehicles per day. Since this section of Weaver Lake Road is already experiencing traffic volumes over the roadway's capacity, it is not all that surprising that there are times during the day (specifically the morning and afternoon rush hours) when there is traffic congestion, delays, and vehicular queues. In addition to the high level of traffic volumes along this segment of Weaver Lake Road, a major employer (Boston Scientific) is located on the north side of Weaver Lake Road and the Weaver Lake Road/West Fish Lake Road signalized intersection is the only full access in/out of a facility that has over 2,000 employees on a daily basis. This single full access in/out of such a large facility would place a heavy burden on any roadway facility during peak hours and shift changes.

### **Comment #1 – Long Delays at Traffic Lights:**

**Response to Comment #1:** We are well aware of congestion issues along this section of Weaver Lake Road, and are continually working with Hennepin County to optimize the traffic signal timing along Weaver Lake Road in order to minimize delays along the corridor. I mentioned Hennepin County because Weaver Lake Road becomes a county road east of I-94, and our traffic signals west of I-94 are coordinated with the County's traffic signal system east of I-94.

### **Comment #2 – Increase in traffic volume in recent weeks:**

**Response to Comment #2:** The increase in traffic volumes along Weaver Lake Road, west of I-94 in recent weeks are likely due to a number of area projects, including:

- NB Ramps to/from I-494 at the Bass Lake Road Interchange have been closed since August 8<sup>th</sup> as part of MnDOT's I-494 Rehab Project. These ramps are scheduled to reopen sometime in mid-September.
- East Fish Lake Road Bridge Closure as part of MnDOT's I-494 Rehab Project. The East Fish Lake Bridge was closed from September 1<sup>st</sup> through September 13<sup>th</sup>.
- County Road 30 mill and overlay project in Corcoran (from east of County Road 19 to County Road 101). This Hennepin County project is a short-term pavement rehab project that will last from September 12<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup>, weather permitting.

The increase in traffic may also be due in part to the end of summer and the start of the school year. If you look at the volumes on many streets within the metropolitan area, traffic volumes tend to decrease over the summer months, and then increase again after Labor Day.

Once these construction projects have ended, traffic patterns in the area should stabilize, and volumes along Weaver Lake Road should return to normal over the coming months.

**Comment #3 – Has the County recently conducted any traffic light studies or updates on the light sequencing of that corridor?**

**Response to Comment #3:** Neither the County nor the City have recently conducted any signal optimization studies along Weaver Lake Road. As mentioned in my earlier January 2016 CAC Report Response regarding concerns about traffic backups along Weaver Lake Road west of I-94, there are a number of large construction projects in the area that have contributed to an increase in traffic volumes and congestion along Weaver Lake Road (i.e. – I-494 Rehab Project and the TH 610 connection to I-94). Both of these projects will be completed in the fall of 2016. Once these large construction projects are completed, and traffic patterns in the area stabilize, we will work with Hennepin County to update the signal timing and coordination along the entire Weaver Lake Road corridor, as needed.

**Comment #4 – Are there any new plans for roadway or signalization improvements?**

**Response to Comment #4:** There are currently no plans for roadway or signalized improvements along Weaver Lake Road, west of I-94.

Unfortunately, there is very little room to expand the Weaver Lake Road between West Fish Lake Road and I-94 by adding additional lanes, due to Weaver Lake on the south side of the road and Rice Lake on the north side of the road. Therefore, we are somewhat limited in our ability to add more capacity to this segment of roadway. City staff has considered some potential high-level concepts for the Weaver Lake Road/I-94 interchange that might help to improve the overall operation of the interchange, but these concepts would require significant future investment from the State, County, and the City, and many years to develop.

The good news is that, in addition to our ongoing work with the County to optimize the traffic signal timing along Weaver Lake Road, the City of Maple Grove is also pursuing improvements to other area roadways that will help to pull some future traffic away from the heavily congested Weaver Lake Road/I-94 interchange. With the completion of the Highway 610 connection to I-94 later this year, and the planned future County Road 610 connection between County Road 30 and I-94, it is anticipated that as many as 6,000 vehicles per day will be removed from Weaver Lake Road in the vicinity of the I-94 interchange. This will help to reduce some of the congestion along Weaver Lake Road between West Fish Lake Road and I-94. We will also continue to encourage Boston Scientific and other large employers in the area to consider flexible work schedules and promote transit/carpool use among their employees in order to reduce the impacts of commuting traffic on the heavily congested corridor. Finally, the City of Maple Grove is also looking for ways to enhance transit ridership within heavily-traveled corridors. Examples of this within the Weaver Lake Road corridor are Maple Grove Transit's two bus routes along Weaver Lake Road, and the Crosswinds Church Park & Ride located in the southwest quadrant of the Weaver Lake Road/West Fish Lake Road intersection, across the street from Boston Scientific.

Hope this helps to provide some additional information not only on the heavily congested section of Weaver Lake Road west of I-94, but also the many avenues that the City and our other local partners (such as Hennepin County, MnDOT, and MetroTransit) are pursuing to minimize the congestion along this busy corridor today and in the future.



### **Survey Update**

The final completed survey counts when the survey closed on October 3 were as follows:

- Mailed survey - 449 respondents
- Open participation web survey - 542 respondents

As outlined in the survey consultant proposal, National Research Center (NRC) staff will now review each dataset and evaluate the quality of the web data to see if it may make sense to combine the datasets into one. If combining is an option, NRC will review it with City staff and get our input before they move forward. If combining doesn't look like the right approach after NRC's investigation, they will report the open participation web data in table form under a separate cover
