

## **Definitions**

**Council** - refers to the City Council of Maple Grove.

**Counter-clockwise** - means of direction of travel with the nearest shore on one's right when facing direction of movement.

**Cross Bar** - refers to the portion of any "L" shaped or "T" shaped dock which parallels the abutting shoreline.

**Daytime** - period sunrise to sunset.

**Dock** - refers to any wharf, pier or other structure constructed or maintained in, on, or over the water. This includes all "L" and "T" shaped structures and posts which are parts thereof.

**"Dock Set-Back Zone"** - refers to the portion of any lake which lies within one hundred (100) feet of the ordinary high water mark and is bounded by a line inside of, parallel to and ten (10) feet from each of the two (2) extended side lot lines of any lakeshore site, as measured at right angles to the extended side lot lines.

**Lake** - refers to the mentioned bodies of water located wholly and partially within the corporate limits of the City of Maple Grove and all parts, bays and channels thereof:

**Cedar Island Lake, Eagle Lake, Fish Lake, Pike Lake, Rice Lake, Edward Lake and Weaver Lake.**

**Lakeshore Site** - refers to any lot, parcel or other tract of land legally subdivided and recorded with the County which abuts any lake.

**Nighttime** - period sunset to sunrise.

**Ordinary High Water Marks** - refers to the point of the highest level of lake water that has been maintained for such a long period of time that evidence of vegetation on the landscape can be found. It is usually that point where natural vegetation changes from predominantly aquatic to predominantly terrestrial.

**Overnight** - refers to any time between the hours of 2:00 am and 5:00 am of any day.

**Slow-No Wake** - refers to the operation of watercraft at the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage and in no case shall exceed five (5) miles per hour.

**Structure** - refers to any thing which is built, constructed or erected; an edifice or building of any kind; or any piece of work artificially built up and for composed of parts joined together in some definite manner, whether temporary or permanent in character.

**Swimming Area** - refers to an area immediately adjacent to the shoreline which is marked in accordance to the Minnesota D.N.R. regulations and is used solely for recreational swimming.

**Swimming Raft** - refers to small floating structure no more than (100) square feet in area designed and used exclusively for sunbathing and rest from swimming.

**Watercraft** - refers to any mechanical device used or designed for navigation on water except the following: 1. A duck boat during hunting season, 2. A rice boat during harvest season, 3. Seaplanes

**Water Obstacle** - refers to any ski jump, slalom course, diving tower or other structure in or upon the water of any lake, **except** any dock, swimming raft or watercraft.
